What is Fintech Meetup?

[Fintech Meetup](#) is a conference that focuses on facilitating meetings and connections by leveraging proprietary matching algorithms that deliver results. It draws from across the entire fintech ecosystem, covering over 130 categories of services and solutions.

In addition to meetings, there are presentations from industry thought leaders as well as content around the latest innovations, trends and technologies disrupting payments, and banking and financial services.

What can I expect from participating?

Participating companies can expect up to 24 double opt-in 15-minute arranged meetings with industry leaders and professionals. In addition, through this delegation, companies can access up to 4 hosted meetings with credit unions and small banks (<\$100B under management), as well as merchants and retailers.

- One ticket per company (Current value approx. \$2400 CAD); ability to buy one additional ticket for a team member for \$500 CAD.
- Up to 4 hosted meetings per company (value up to \$3400 CAD)
- Up to 24 double opt-in meetings
